


















Example 2: numeracy

2.5 "THE MODERN JAVELIN"

Learners attend a sporting event where the javelin is one of the events. Before going to the event, learners find out the personal bests of the competitors. Learners then calculate the differences between the results on the day. They could also compare them with the personal bests.

And/or: Let the learners throw, for example, a Frisbee, measure the distance thrown and calculate in the same way shown above.

Extension: convert distances between metric and Imperial measures.

	"PROFESSIONS WITHIN A SPORTS CLUB"			
The learners are given a tour of their football club. During the tour they will see different professions and positions within the organisation.				
	The learners work in teams of 3 or 4, writing down at least 12 jobs (or positions) that they have noted.			
	For each job, they write down three tasks involved in them.

Example 4: ICT

"WHAT KIND OF COMPUTERS?"

Learners look at computer equipment in a selected place (e.g., local sports club) and write down the names of the parts (e.g. monitor, graphics card, memory, processor and primary storage capacity) and their specifications.

They check the prices with the people who bought them and then find out from the Web how much such computers would cost today.

They present the results on a spreadsheet.
